- **City Council Highlights September 14, 2016**
- **Attendance:** Mayor David Blain, Councilmembers John Brasier, Jon Holst, Nadine Ball and 0 citizens. Craig Sturman was excused.
- Mayor Blain called the meeting to order at 7:44 PM and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Scott Norman gave the opening prayer.
- **FIRE REPORT** – Chief Scott Norman reported 22 members with 19 attending regular training. He reported 927 total hours: 105 training hours; 32 PR/meeting hours; 705 hours on actual fire calls (1 call to Ammon (canceled), 1 call to assist Ammon, 2 calls in Ucon, Firth fire, Carrot fire in Tetonia, Henry's Creek fire); 85 hours maintenance. They have submitted request for reimbursement on the Henry's Creek fire and are awaiting payment. The department received a \$1,500 grant for training. There is a burn ban in all of Bonneville County until October 27th – no open fires.
- **POLICE REPORT** – Officer Jacob Fullmer reported 360 patrol hours; 40 grant overtime hours; 3 call outs; 1 arrest/warrant; 30 traffic stops; 11 traffic citations; 1 non-traffic citation; 25 complaints responded to; 1 special event, 3 special patrols; 1 traffic accident; 8 hours other. Officer Fullmer thanked Scott Norman and the fire department and Daniel Morgan for their help on the fire at Eagle Rock Fur.
- **P&Z REPORT** – Tyler Baum reported that a meeting was held on August 25th and a public hearing was held to consider a lot split request by Stephanie Brown at 10670 N 38 E. He reported that no one was opposed to the lot split and that the Planning and Zoning commission recommended approval of the lot split. The council discussed future water and sewer needs to the two proposed lots. The council voted to approve the request.
- **WATER & SEWER SYSTEM REPORT** – Daniel Morgan reported that he is seeking bids for the VFD installation and rewiring. He is preparing to haul sand and will be getting the plow truck ready for winter. He is planning to start cleaning sewers from Yellowstone west. OxyPro has been ordered. He suggested that the council consider rebuilding two leaking hydrants. The hydrant between Snake River Potato and Eagle Rock Fur leaks when it is turned on and he suggests replacement.
- **IDAHO FALLS SEWER AGREEMENT** - John Brasier presented a list of pollutant limits for wastewater sent to the City of Idaho Falls wastewater plant and said that we should not have any issues meeting the requirements. The City of Idaho Falls has revised the wastewater agreement he presented last month and he asked the clerk to forward the revision to the council members and add it to the

October agenda.

- **BUDGET STATUS** – Mayor Blain reported that 92% of the budget year has passed and all funds are on track for this time of year.
- **CITY COUNCIL MEETING ADJOURNED AT 9:57 PM.**
