City Council Highlights – January 10, 2018

- Mayor Blain, John Brasier, Nadine Ball, Jon Holst and Craig Sturman and several citizens were present. Mayor Blain called the meeting to order at 7:31 P.M. and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Vernon Hill gave the opening prayer.
- Mayor Blain read resignation letters from Councilmember Craig Sturman and Planning & Zoning chairman Tyrell Maughan.
- MINUTES OF DECEMBER 13, 2017 MEETING the minutes were approved with one correction.
- TREASURER'S REPORT, PRESENTATION OF BILLS AND TRANSFERS TO/FROM STATE POOL The clerk presented the treasurer's report. A motion was made by Craig Sturman and seconded by John Brasier to approve the treasurer's report, bill payments and transfers to/from the state pool. All in favor; none opposed. Motion carried.
- OATHS OF OFFICE/CERTIFICATES OF ELECTION -The clerk administered the Oaths of Office for Mayor Craig Sturman and Councilmembers Johnalee McDonald and Tyrell Maughan and presented their Certificates of Election. Mayor Blain and Councilmembers Nadine Ball and Jon Holst were excused.
- ELECT-COUNCIL PRESIDENT John Brasier was elected as council president.
- APPOINTMENT TO FILL VACANT COUNCIL SEAT the council approved the appointment of Phillip Campbell.
- COUNCIL DEPARTMENT ASSIGNMENTS Water/Sewer: John Brasier Parks, Landscape & Rec, Founders' Day: Johnalee McDonald

Public Relations/Social Media/Finance: Phillip Campbell

Planning & Zoning/Roads: Tyrell Maughan Police/Fire: Mayor Sturman

- P&Z REPORT Tyrell Maughan reported that a few building permits were approved at their November meeting and their recommendation on the conditional use permit is being finalized,
- P&Z VACANCY Larry Gilmore was appointed to fill one of two vacant seats on P&Z.
- FIRE REPORT Jake Fullmer presented the fire report as Scott Norman was out of town. Paul Pearson reported that they had a few calls to Ammon that were canceled enroute. They just received \$17,000 worth of radios on a grant. Officer Fullmer reported that Scott Norman purchased gift cards and some toys and when Officer

Fullmer pulled people over for minor violations, they received a toy or gift card instead of a citation.

- POLICE REPORT Officer Fullmer thanked Mayor Blain, Nadine Ball, and Jon Holst for their years of service on the council. He stated that he and Daniel had installed a new no parking sign at the pit. He stated that in the coming months he will be working on a new parking resolution. He participated in the Shop With a Cop program again this year. It is a great program. He stated that his bullet-proof vest is outdated and needs to be replaced. He requested and received authorization to purchase a new bullet-proof vest and a Taser.
- LANDSCAPE & REC COMMITTEE REPORT Nadine Ball stated that she had completed the Tree City USA application.
- WATER & SEWER SYSTEM REPORT Daniel Morgan stated that he installed a new flow meter in Well #1 and it should be ready to go by the end of the week. Snow removal is going fine. He presented the fuel consumption report. He reported that the security fence is now complete. John Brasier presented the council members with Resolution #61 Water/Sewer Rates and graphs for power and sewer gallons pumped to Idaho Falls.
- EXECUTIVE SESSION (EMPLOYEE EVALUATIONS) (IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDAHO CODE 74-206(1) (b)) The council voted unanimously to enter into executive session at 8:26 PM to discuss employee evaluations. The regular meeting reconvened at 8:55 PM.
- The council voted to give employee raises effective 1/16/18.
- CITY COUNCIL MEETING ADJOURNED AT 8:56 P.M.
