#### **City Council Highlights**

#### August 3, 2018—Special Meeting

The council voted to trade Engine #2 in for a 1993 International Ladder Truck for the fire department for a net cost of \$18,995.

### August 8, 2018—City Council Meeting

- John Brasier and Johnalee McDonald were present. Mayor Sturman and Tyrell Maughan participated via phone. Phillip Campbell was excused. There were no citizens present.
- John Brasier called the meeting to order at 7:50 P.M. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- PUBLIC HEARING FY19 BUDGET John Brasier opened the public hearing at 7:46 PM and explained that the purpose of the public hearing is to hear comments regarding the FY19 budget. No comments were heard as there were no citizens present. The public hearing was closed at 7:50 PM and the regular meeting resumed at 7:51 PM.
- ORDINANCE #181 FY19 BUDGET The council approved the ordinance.
- POLICE REPORT Chief Jake Fullmer reported 164 patrol hours; 3 investigation/court; 4 overtime hours; 4 call outs; 1 arrest/warrant; 21 traffic stops; 10 traffic citations issued; 2 non-traffic citations; 16 incidents responded to; 1 special patrol; 1 state police assist. He requested and received approval to purchase 3 new batteries and a new radar. Chief Fullmer stated that he has been working on beautification issues.
- FIRE REPORT Chief Scott Norman reported 16 members; 130 training hours; 65 chief hours; 17 calls; 2 false calls; 6 calls; 62 maintenance hours; 134 Department of Lands hours Total: 488 hours. He stated that the fire tender with one person is in Challis for dust abatement for up to 14 days. The rate from Department of Lands is \$178 per hour. The department has been requested to stand by for any fires. If something happens in Ucon, they will still respond. Chief Norman expressed his gratitude to the council for allowing them to respond to wild land fires. The ladder truck has a few minor issues but will be in service tonight. He requested and received approval for \$1,000 for fittings for the ladder truck and oil for HEMTT.
- P & Z REPORT the city clerk reported that a meeting was held on July 26 to review the setbacks and zoning on a building permit.
- LANDSCAPE & REC COMMITTEE REPORT Johnalee McDonald reported that Founders' Day preparations are underway.



- WATER & SEWER SYSTEM REPORT Daniel Morgan reported that the trees at Well #3 need to be taken down. He received bids for \$6,000 and \$3900. The merry-go-round has been repaired. We're still waiting for the permit from Bureau of Reclamation to bring power across the canal for the sewer grinder installation. Mayor Sturman stated that he will be preparing a comprehensive water audit and will be installing meters in the parks.
- CITY COUNCIL MEETING ADJOURNED AT 9:21 P.M.

# CITY OF UCON ORDINANCE # 181: ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2018, APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$1,222,400 TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSE AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF UCON FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR; AUTHORIZING A LEVY OF A SUFFICIENT TAX UPON THE TAXABLE PROPERTY AND SPECIFYING THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES FOR WHICH SAID APPROPRIATION IS MADE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UCON, BONNEVILLE COUNTY, IDAHO:

Section 1: That the sum of \$1,222,400 be appropriated to defray the necessary expenses and liabilities of the City of Ucon, Bonneville County, Idaho for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2018.

Section 2: The objects and purposes for which such appropriation is made, and the amount of each object and purpose is as follows:

Police Department	\$170,400
Fire Department	\$ 49,400
General Administration	\$ 71,900
Parks	\$ 77,200
Roads	\$ 53,500
Total General Fund	\$422,400
Water Fund	\$298,400
Sewer Fund	\$501,600
Total Water & Sewer Fund	\$800,000
Total Appropriations	\$1,222,400

Section 3: That a general tax levy on all taxable property within the City of Ucon be levied in an amount allowed by law for the general purposes for said City, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2018.

Section 4: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5: This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force upon its passage, approval and publication in one issue of the Post Register, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Ucon, and the official newspaper of said City.

PASSED under suspension of rules upon which a roll call vote was taken and duly enacted at a regular meeting of the Mayor and City Council held on the 8th day of August 2018.

APPROVED by the Mayor this 8th day of August, 2018.
