November

October 13, 2021 – City Council Highlights

Mayor Sturman, John Brasier, Johnalee McDonald, Larry Gilmore, Tyrell Maughan, and no citizens were present. Mayor Sturman called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. and led the Pledge of Allegiance. PUBLIC HEARING – WATER/SEWER RATE INCREASE – Mayor Sturman Opened the public hearing at 7:31 PM and explained that he has negotiated with the City of Idaho Falls and has gotten nowhere. He stated that in order to cover the rate increase from Idaho Falls, sewer rates will need to be increased \$2 per month and in order to cover pumping costs and fund depreciation water rates will increase \$1 per month. No public comments were received. Mayor Sturman closed the public hearing at 7:40 P.M.

RESOLUTION #67 WATER/SEWER RATES – The council unanimously approved the resolution increasing water and sewer rates effective December 1st.

POLICE REPORT – Chief Fullmer reported 172 patrol hours; 3 callouts; 24 training hours; 1 arrest/ warrant; 32 traffic stops; 19 traffic citations issued; 2 non-traffic citations; 40 incidents responded to; 4 animal control calls; 3 special patrol/vacation watch; 1 alarm; 2 traffic accidents; 4 other agency assists; 1 medical call. The Ucon Elementary Halloween Carnival will be held on October 23rd and the Trunk-or-Treats on October 30th at 6 P.M. FIRE REPORT – Chief Norman reported 23 members, 18 attending regular training, and six wildland members; 205 training hours; 105 chief hours; 186 hours on six actual calls (2 calls in Ammon; 1 call in Idaho Falls; 2 calls in Ucon; 1 *Jefferson County assist)*; 45 hours maintenance; 905 wildland hours; 1446 total hours. He stated that the 9/11 memorial went well. He reported that the SCBA's will be out of service next year and no parts are available for them. He presented a quote for \$76,490 to replace ten SCBA's and stated that the cost will go up to \$102,000 if they are ordered after November 1st. He received approval to spend up to \$80,000 from wildland funds to purchase ten SCBA's. Chief Norman requested and received approval to acquire a 2004 Freightliner from Bureau of Land Management (no cost to the city) and \$20,000 to build the truck to replace the Kenworth tender. The truck will be owned by the

city after it has been in service for one year. PUBLIC WORKS REPORT - Daniel Morgan reported that they are still cleaning sewer lines and will be winterizing sprinklers and removing the tennis court nets. The snow plows are ready for the season. He requested and received approval to excess the 1998 Chevrolet parks truck via auction. WATER & SEWER SYSTEM REPORT – John Brasier reported that flows are down. Mayor Sturman will research increasing water and sewer connect fees and it will be on the agenda for the November meeting.

BMPO REPORT – Larry Gilmore reported that the long-range transportation plan was discussed. CITY COUNCIL MEETING ADJOURNED at 9:00 P.M.
