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City Council Highlights – January 12, 2022

Mayor Sturman, John Brasier, Johnalee McDonald, Larry Gilmore, Tyrell Maughan, and no citizens were present. Mayor Sturman called the meeting to order at 7:36 P.M. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

AUDIT REPORT – SEARLE HART – Farrell Steiner presented the FY2021 audit and management reports. He explained the report and graphs in detail and stated that the books are in excellent order and that the audit controls are working well. No concerns were noted on the audit. The council approved the audit.

LIQUOR LICENSE RENEWAL – GOOD2GO – The council approved the liquor license.

FIRE TRUCK PURCHASE – Mayor Sturman stated that he received a request from Chief Norman to purchase a 2003 Emergency One fire truck from another fire department in Missouri for \$30,000 and he contacted each council member via phone for approval to purchase it. The council approved the purchase.

OATHS OF OFFICE FOR NEWLY ELECTED COUNCIL MEMBERS – The city clerk administered the Oaths of Office and presented Certificates of Election to reelected Mayor Craig Sturman and Councilor Tyrell Maughan. The clerk will administer the Oath of Office to Johnalee McDonald at the February meeting.

ELECT-COUNCIL PRESIDENT – John Brasier will continue to serve as council president.

COUNCIL DEPARTMENT ASSIGNMENTS – no changes to the existing assignments were made.

Larry Gilmore: Bonneville Metropolitan Planning Organization (BMPO) board.

Tyrell Maughan: Parks & Rec/Arbor Day.

John Brasier: Water & Sewer

Johnalee McDonald: Founders Day

POLICE REPORT – Chief Fullmer reported 163 patrol hours; 2 call outs; 23 traffic stops; 12 traffic citations issued; 33 incidents responded to; 2 special events attended; 1 special patrol; 1 alarm; 2 traffic accidents; 1 other agency assist; 1 medical call. Chief Fullmer stated that he participated in Shop With A Cop in December and the kids had a great time. He stated that the New Year's party was amazing and thanked Chief Norman and the fire department. He encouraged the council to draft a parking fine resolution.

FIRE REPORT – Chief Norman reported 23 members, 18 attending regular training, and six wildland members; 22 training hours; 88 chief hours; 5 hours on actual calls (1 – Ammon (canceled); 1 – Bonneville County assist); 45 hours maintenance; 160 total hours. The training planned in Swan Valley was canceled. He stated that the new fire truck is impressive. The council approved \$5,000 from wildland funds for the purchase of lights,

tires, and other items necessary to put the truck into service.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT – no report

WATER & SEWER SYSTEM REPORT – John Brasier stated that December flows were up slightly. Mayor Sturman stated that the sewer study is nearing completion.

PLANNING & ZONING – no report

BMPO – Larry Gilmore stated that no meeting was held in December.

ADJOURNMENT – The council meeting adjourned at 8:57 P.M.
