### City Council Highlights—July 13, 2022

John Brasier, Larry Gilmore, Johnalee McDonald, Tyrell Maughan, and no citizens were present. Craig Sturman was excused. John Brasier called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**POLICE REPORT** – Chief Fullmer reported 164 patrol hours; 2 call outs; 48 traffic stops; 25 traffic citations issued; 3 non-traffic citations issued; 104 calls for service; 3 animal complaints; 1 special event attended; 3 special patrols; 1 alarm; 4 traffic accidents; 4 other agency assists; 1 medical call. He reported a busy month with lots of calls. He stated that the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Firefighter breakfast was awesome. The new officer will start in August. He has been patrolling the parks more often to check for vandalism.

**FIRE REPORT** – Chief Scott Norman reported 23 members, 18 attending regular training, and 8 wildland members. 130 training hours; 91 chief hours; 1 hour on one fire call in Ucon; 55 hours maintenance; 732 wildland hours; 277 total hours. Chief Norman reported that the 35<sup>th</sup> annual 4<sup>th</sup> of July Firefighter breakfast was very well attended and over \$2,000 in donations were received. He thanked Daniel Morgan and Josh Barnes for their help and Johnalee McDonald for providing extra food when they ran out. He thanked Chief Fullmer for his support. He is projecting a very busy year for wildland. He informed the council that Bonneville County did not have the final numbers ready on the dozer. He hopes to have the radios acquired under the grant that he and Chief Fullmer applied for by November 1<sup>st</sup>. He stated that they are going to try out a different gear oil for the wildland trucks since they are having issues with the intermediate axles getting hot and breaking down the oil. The oil new is much more expensive but is expected to have four times the lifespan of the regular gear oil. They are hoping the new oil will improve the longevity of the trucks.

**LANDSCAPE & REC** – Johnalee McDonald reported that Founders' Day planning is underway. The event will be held on Saturday, August 13<sup>th</sup>.

**PUBLIC WORKS REPORT** – Daniel Morgan reported a broken water main 36 East and 105 North. DDR Contractor was hired to replace the line and were on site 45 minutes after the leak was discovered; the leak was repaired in about four hours. They are making great progress on the park shelter and the concrete will be poured soon. A new parks employee has been hired.

**WATER & SEWER SYSTEM REPORT** - John Brasier reported sewer flows were lower than last year.

**12" WATER LINE EXTENSION – ADVERTISE FOR BIDS** The clerk reported that the bid package from Aspen Engineering for the 12-inch water line extension is complete. The council unanimously approved advertising for bids on the project.

**BMPO REPORT** – Larry Gilmore reported that five requests for bids on the arterial study were sent out, but only one was received.

**SCHEDULE SPECIAL COUNCIL WORK MEETING FOR FY2023 BUDGET** – The special council meeting was scheduled for Monday, August 1<sup>st</sup> at 7:00 P.M.

## Resolution No. TBD

**A resolution of the City of Ucon, Bonneville County, Idaho declaring the intent to collect \$2,895 in forgone property taxes for fiscal year 2021 and declaring the purpose for which the forgone taxes are being budgeted.**

WHEREAS, the City of Ucon intends to include \$2,895 of its accumulated balance of \$20,747 in Forgone taxes in its FY 2023 budget as authorized by Idaho Code Section 63-802; and  
 WHEREAS, the purpose for the levy of Forgone taxes is to build reserves in all levy funds to take pressure off of the General Fund; and  
 WHEREAS, the City will provide notice of its intention to levy Forgone taxes by publishing a notice in the Post Register 8/2/2022 and again on 8/9/2022; and  
 WHEREAS, the City Council will hold a public hearing concerning its intention to collect the Forgone taxes as contemplated by this Resolution on 8/10/2022 in order to receive public comment on the proposal; and  
 WHEREAS, the published notice and public hearing satisfied the notice and hearing requirements in Idaho Code Section 63-802.

## Resolution No. TBD

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF UCON, IDAHO RESERVING THE FORGONE AMOUNT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021 FOR POTENTIAL USE IN SUBSEQUENT YEARS AS DESCRIBED IN IDAHO CODE §63-802, et al.**

WHEREAS, Idaho Code §50-235 empowers the city council of each city to levy taxes for general revenue purposes; and,  
 WHEREAS, Idaho Code §50-1002 requires the city council of each city in the State of Idaho to pass a budget, referred to as an annual appropriation ordinance; and,  
 WHEREAS, Idaho Code §63-802 sets limitations on all taxing district budget requests on the amount of property tax revenues that can be used to fund programs and services; and,  
 WHEREAS, Idaho Code §63-802(1)(f) requires that the City adopt an annual resolution to reserve additional forgone amount in order to utilize that amount in subsequent years; and,  
 WHEREAS, the City has met the notice and hearing requirements in Idaho Code §63-802(1)(f) to reserve the current year's increase in the forgone amount; and,  
 WHEREAS, the City intends to reserve \$2,895 of its current year's increase in allowable forgone amount.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UCON, IDAHO, that \$2,895 of the current year's allowable increase in its forgone amount is reserved and included in the City's total forgone balance for potential use in subsequent years.
