October 11, 2023– City Council Highlights

Craig Sturman, John Brasier, Larry Gilmore, Johnalee McDonald, Tyrell Maughan and 3 citizens were present. Craig Sturman called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

FIRE REPORT – Chief Scott Norman reported 20 members, 15 attending regular training, and 3 wildland members; 120 training hours; 105 chief hours; 6 hours on 3 calls (2 to Ammon one canceled in route, one chicken coop fire which was out when they arrived); 1 Idaho Falls assist); 15 hours maintenance; 0 wildland hours; 240 total hours. All wildland equipment is back; possibly done for the season. They are still working on the radios. Most of the equipment from last month’s approvals has arrived. The ISO (Insurance Services Office) fire score inspection went well. The ISO rating determines the monthly insurance rates for residents and businesses.

POLICE REPORT – Chief Fullmer reported no major problems. The Durango is done and on the road. He thanked the council for upgrading the vehicle. Officer Parmer will be switched to the Ford Explorer. He is not sure if there will be Halloween Trunk-or-Treats this year, but the police department will be handing out candy.

LANDSCAPE & REC – Tyrell Maughan reported that Lisa Jensen of 3418 E 107 N is the September Yard of the Month winner. Mayor Sturman stated that the New Year’s celebration will be held on Saturday, December 30th at 6:30 P.M. Hot dogs and hot chocolate will be served, and the fireworks will be at 9 P.M.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT – Mayor Sturman reported that public works has been working on patching and crack sealing on 41st East and Crooked Tree. The force main plugged again at the Tower Road lift station most likely due to rocks from the earlier repair.

WATER & SEWER SYSTEM REPORT – John Brasier reported sewer flow to Idaho Falls 4.4 million gallons which is down 800,000 gallons from last month.

PLANNING & ZONING – The clerk stated that a public hearing will be held on Wednesday, October 25th at 7 P.M. to consider a variance application from Leo Espinoza at 11015 N Yellowstone Highway to reduce the minimum building setbacks.

BMPO REPORT – Larry Gilmore reported that BMPO is working on some fiscal year wrap-up and there is \$16 million left for projects. Projects which will use up the leftover funds are repairs to the bridge on Pancheri, repairs on Ammon Road (county side) and Iona Road (county side), and road repairs in the City of Iona.
